Our first development opportunity came when Home-Start Harrow sadly closed last year. Thanks to an inspiring funding opportunity from John Lyon's Charity, together with the energy and enthusiasm of staff and trustees in Barnet, Home-Start Barnet's Harrow Project came about The project is going from strength to strength and I'm delighted to report that Home-Start's core service is back in place for vulnerable families in Harrow.

Another extremely exciting project, and one with which I have been closely involved, is the setting up of a London consortium of Home-Start schemes. This is about to become a legal entity allowing schemes the opportunity to expand their services by working together on pan-London contracts and collectively reach many more vulnerable families, especially in areas where no Home-Start services are currently offered.

Our third new project entailed becoming a partner in HealthWatch Barnet, a new government initiative set up across the country to ensure local people have a powerful voice about their own health and social care services. This has been a great opportunity for Home-Start to partner with other Barnet charities and work together to identify concerns - or highlight good practice - about services in the borough.

Finally, I would like to extend my invitation of previous years. Drop in to our offices any time for a coffee, a chat and to enjoy the wonderful view of the beautiful Avenue House grounds!

Treasurer's Report



The summary below shows what a difficult year we experienced up to the end of March 2014. We undertook a number of new projects during the year including extending our geographical reach into Harrow with the support of John Lyons Charity. We were one of the fortunate charities whose support by the London Borough of Barnet continued. However we did not escape the swingeing cuts that LBB has made to the funds available to support the most deserving families and youths in the Borough. We had to renegotiate our main contract with LBB leading to a 38% reduction in funds. Nevertheless, LBB remains our largest funder (under 60%) and we are grateful for the support they provide.



Love Food-Hate Waste visited our group and encouraged our families to develop a better knowledge of food by showing them how much we waste and how to save money. The families found it useful as made them aware of how much food they were throwing away.

We also took part in a five-week creative writing course making fantastic storybooks for our children, using all sorts of equipment. At the end of the course each parent took home a book they had made for their child. This was so popular that they have asked for it to be repeated.

Our Red Nose Day event raised £88. The children took part in a sponsored obstacle race and took home sponsor forms to collect donations from their friends and families. They found it fun collecting badges for every race!

The fun day event in aid of Children in Need saw our staff cooking a homemade breakfast for all the children and parents, while the children were sponsored by their families for their performance in 'Dance till you Drop in your PJs' - and they did just that!!!

We are a member of HealthWatch Barnet, a consortium of ten local voluntary organisations led by CommUNITY Barnet to deliver a 3-year contract on information, advice and signposting of health and social care in Barnet. Home-Start Barnet's role is to capture the views of families, and young parents with young children, about their accessibility to health services

During the year,we used a wide range of quantitative and qualitative methods - including web-based social media, newsletters, focus groups and one-to-one interviews - to engage, inform and consult with families and young parents and report our findings back to HealthWatch Barnet. The report appears on our website.

parenting programmes

During the past year Home-Start Barnet delivered six evidence-based parenting programmes in partnership with Bell Lane Children's Centre, Bell Lane Primary School, Childs Hill Children's Centre, Underhill Children's Centre and Stonegrove Children's Centre. In partnership with the Hyde Children Centre and Newstead Children Centre we also delivered six Women's Support Groups as part of the Safer Families Domestic Violence programme.



Caroline - Volunteer Community Coach

One of the families I helped was on the poverty line due to debt issues, and managing to exist only by accessing the Food Bank. Add to that, the family has two autistic teenagers with mental health problems.

Initially, I built a rapport with the family and undertook to support them by arranging, via Step Change, a solution for their debt problems. The result was that their debts were written off with a Debt Recovery Order. This gave the family peace of mind and also freed up much needed money to live on.

With support and encouragement from Home-Start, the family pursued other benefits to which they were entitled. They were successful and benefits were backdated to when we became involved.

This peace of mind enabled the mother to seek out college places for her sons. One son, who had previously been in trouble with the police, is now excelling on a music course, and the other is very happy on an Art and Design course.

The change in this family is amazing. There will always be issues but they are now empowered to seek help rather than bury their heads in the sand. It's been a steep learning curve for me but the experience has been so rewarding.
